Student Arrivals

- The designated car parks for all student arrivals are Apple 2 and 3.
- Students will be expected to arrive between 6.45pm and 7.30pm. Their cars will be directed from the main North Gate.
- There is ample space for manoeuvre but cars will not be able to park.
- Students leaving the cars will proceed down the covered walkway and onto the red carpet.
- Apple 2 and 3 are very close to the entrance and students will not have far to walk.
- For safety reasons, no one should be standing or waiting in the car parks.

Parking for parents and staff

Parents will be directed to Banana car park and teaching staff will be directed to Apple 2 and 3.

Photographing opportunities for parents

Parents and staff are asked to proceed straight to the covered walkway in “the street” outside the Visitor Centre where there is plenty of space for photographs to be taken of the students as they progress down the red carpet.

Parents will not be able to go onto the red carpet but there is plenty of space in the undercover entrance, which will be fenced off and designated especially for parents.

Photographs

Photographs will be taken in the main Visitor Centre or in the Warm Temperate Biome. Parents will not be able to enter the biomes. Students will be transported to and from the biome by the land train.

Security

All security staff will be provided by the Eden Project.

End of the Ball (The Ball will finish at 11.30pm)

Parents' cars, taxis and mini buses will enter the main North Gate and, after parking, parents can walk down to the covered walkway at the Visitor Centre to meet students. Parents must be aware, however, that they will not be able to enter the Ballroom.

Minibuses and taxis will be directed to park in Banana car park. Drivers should then proceed to the covered walkway with name plaques. This is to ensure that students are collected from the building, not in the car parks.
