GOOD STANDARDS MUST BE MAINTAINED

DICHROIC DANCE

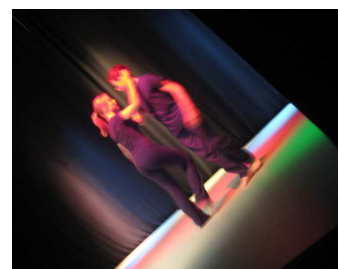
The Keay Theatre

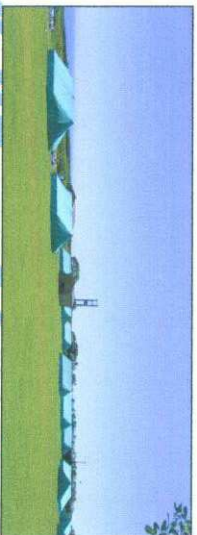

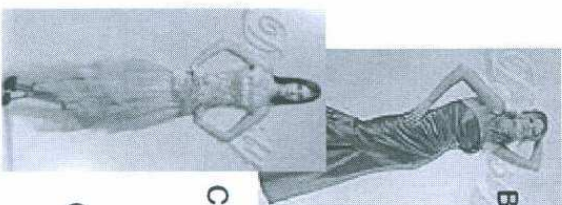

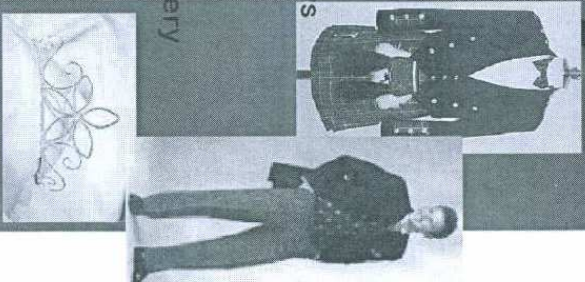
