

PLANNING PERMISSION GRANTED

The school received some great news at the end of last week. Planning permission has been granted for the next phase of the redevelopment of Poltair School. Work will begin at May Half Term and is due to be finally completed by September 2009. There will inevitably have to be some changes to our routines when the demolishing and building takes place but we are very confident that we will manage to maintain the existing calm and ordered environment and that teaching and learning will not be unduly disturbed. On completion we will have a brand new school hall, a new drama studio, improved dining facilities together with a cyber café, a new radio room and reception area. In addition, the whole of the West Block will have been refurbished to create a suite of 'state of the art' classrooms. I would like to thank Peter Booth, our Director of Projects and Premises for the enormous amount of hard work that has gone in order to get us to this stage.
