Geography Fieldwork

On Monday 23rd April, Year 11 GCSE Geography students visited Cardinham Woods to undertake their second, and final, fieldwork.

All students taking GCSE Geography have to complete two different fieldworks during the course; in September, the Year 11 students visited Bristol to carry out fieldwork in a human environment.

At Cardinham, the students demonstrated excellent physical fieldwork skills by measuring the cross-section of the river, the river bedload and the velocity of the river. The data collected is now being presented graphically and analysed in class in readiness for the paper three exam on June 11th.

Year 10 GCSE Geography students will be carrying out their physical fieldwork later this term.
