More Martial Arts Success for Jay!

On Saturday 17th November, Jay Clemow represented the Byrne Blackbelt Academy at the Bulls on Parade Fight Show at the Pryzm Night Club, Plymouth. Jay and his opponent were the same age and weight, however, Jay is predominately a Points/Light Continuous fighter whereas his opponent was trained in K1 Continuous.

The fight was fought over 3 rounds - each 1 minute 30 seconds long.

Jay was nervous on his approach to the ring as he had never fought in a ring before, let alone in front of a 350+ crowd! However, once the bell rang for the start of round 1, Jay's nerves went, he went into fight mode heading straight out of the blocks and over to his opponent - he dominated the 1st round! His opponent tried extremely hard to get inside Jay's leg kicks and attack Jay to the body, but due to Jay's training in "points" fighting he was unable to get close enough. His opponent took a standing count and the 1st round finished.

After a 1 minute break they were into round 2. Jay carried on where he left off, his opponent had a flurry of attacks to try and get inside Jay's kicking range, but he was unsuccessful and the fight finished mid-way through the 2nd round.
