First Aid Protocol

At Poltair, First Aid trained staff are available to deal with both Emergency and non-emergency First Aid when required. Emergency First Aid is our priority in all situations. Coughs, colds and minor ailments are not deemed emergency First Aid situations, unless relevant supplementary information is available to us. So, where necessary, we do ask pupils to remain in lessons where they will be monitored by teaching staff.

If symptoms persist and are making it difficult for the pupil to remain in school, then a parent can be contacted by a First Aider. We ask that pupils do not contact parents directly if feeling unwell in school.

Our Principal First Aider supports pupils with ongoing medical needs in school.

This includes working with parents and health care professionals in both the preparation and review of Health Care Plans for pupils with more serious medical conditions.

We ask parents/carers to keep us informed of any new medical diagnosis that might impact on their child in school or of any changes to conditions/treatments that we need to be aware of.

Medicines will only be administered at school when it would be detrimental to a student's health not to do so.

The School will store and dispense medication to students as long as:

- It is prescription medication which has been prescribed by a medical practitioner with written instructions for its use
- or
- In rare circumstances it is non-prescription medication which has been supplied by the parent/guardian with written instructions for its use

A written parental consent form must be completed before any medicine (prescription or non-prescription) is administered.

The School does not keep or dispense any other medication (other than Salbutamol for use with the emergency asthma kit). Prescription medication brought into school must be clearly labelled with the student's name, dosage, method of administration and be in-date.
